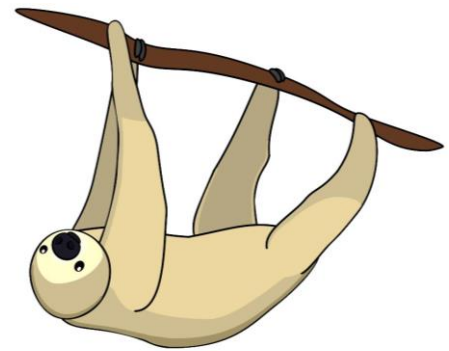
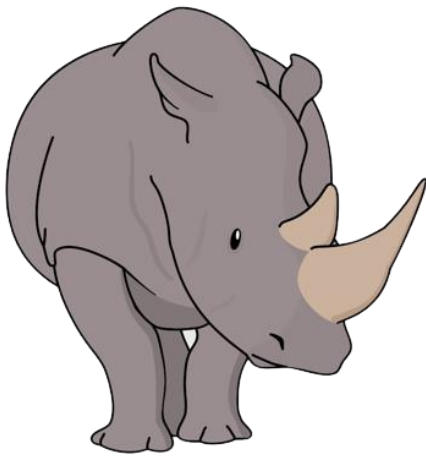


Animals in zoological collections will sometimes move around from place to place across the UK and Europe, particularly as part of breeding programmes for conservation.

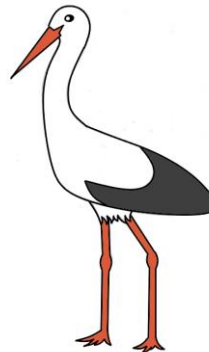
Activity: Find out about an animal of your choice from Cotswold Wildlife Park and create a passport for them.

Support the pupils to research key information about their chosen animal, for their conservation status you can look on the IUCN website <https://www.iucnredlist.org/>



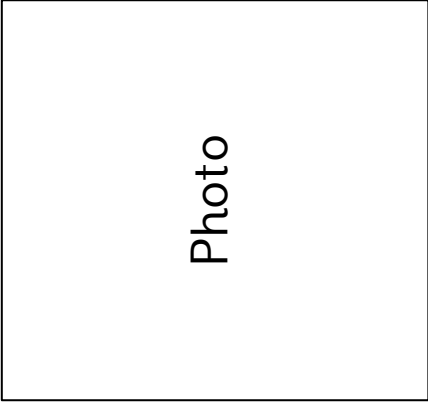
